

COUNCIL BUDGET: TORIES FAIL THE NORTH AGAIN!

The Council has agreed its Budget for 2021/22. The choices were tough. The Government told Councils it supports them to "do what it takes" to tackle the pandemic but refused to cover the cost of providing vital support to our communities and lost income. That betrayal has forced the Council to have to make cuts.

LCC gets its funding from Business Rates, Council Tax (CT), charges for services, and central government grants. In 2010 for every £1 we all paid in Council Tax the Council received about £2 in government grants, we now receive just 50p in support, a reduction of over £250 million every year from the Government so our council tax has to stretch further. Since 2010 the government has cut funding to Leeds by over £2 BILLION. This year Rishi Sunak and the Government is forcing Councils to offset cuts by increasing CT by 5%.
