Tackling Nuisance Bikers and Quads

- You told us you were fed up with Quad Bikes on your green spaces
- We had fencing added around access points to make it harder to access them
- We worked with the Police and Labour Council to obtain a city-wide injunction giving the Police the powers they needed

Removing Unwanted Camps

- You told us you're concerned about illegal camps on your green spaces
- We have worked with the Police and County Courts to have illegal camps removed as soon as possible
- We'll work with the Council and its officers to find a fair way of sharing legal camps across Leeds

Building Affordable Homes

- You told us you needed affordable family homes and flats
- We have supported the building of modern, energy efficient homes across the ward

Future Priorities for Hunslet

- 1. Skills training for new and current workers to take advantage of future well-paid jobs coming to Leeds
- 2. Providing affordable housing to keep communities together
- 3. Improving green spaces, making them accessible and sustainable
- 4. Tackling loneliness and isolation
- 5. Dealing with health issues which reduce life expectancy

Supporting Our Street Homeless

- You wanted us to help our city's street homeless find homes
- Your Labour Council's street-to-accommodation scheme has housed 60+ into accommodation in the last six months alone

Making Breathing Safe

- You wanted the pollution hurting your health and environment reduced
- We support the introduction of a Clean Air Zone this will clean up public commercial transport
- We'll invest in bus lane prioritisation and the new cycle loop taking cars off the road
- The Council has led by example and invested in a low emissions fleet

Protecting Your Homes, Businesses and Work Place

Making Your Street Hygienic

- You told us you are angry about dog fouling on your streets and parks
- We launched an educational campaign which has reduced fouling and have made it clear that when caught, people will be fined or prosecuted

Tackling Hate and Supporting the Police

- You told us you are concerned about hate and other crime
- We protected funding for PCSOs across Leeds and are working with the Police to make sure officers patrol the streets for longer
- CCTV has also been installed on Cross Flatts Park to tackle antisocial behaviour

Keeping Your Streets Clean

- You've told us you are concerned about fly-tipping and bin yard abuse
- We've increased enforcing work, prosecuting those spoiling your community
- The Labour Council is investing in your bin yards, making them harder to tip in, and providing dedicated bin space to remove the need for wheelie bins blocking the paths

Future Priorities for Beeston Hill

- 1. Dealing with rogue landlords who do not meet basic standards
- 2. Providing improved bus access
- 3. Working with the Police and Safer Leeds to reduce crime
- 4. Tackling loneliness and isolation
- 5. Dealing with health issues which reduce life expectancy

- British, EU, or Commonwealth citizens who are permanently resident in the UK
- Registered to vote by the cut-off date

When and Where

- In person between 7 am and 10 pm on Thursday 3 May at You do not need this to vote the Polling Station. Your Polling Card will tell you where to go
- By post if you are registered for a Postal Vote

- Register to vote at gov.uk/register-to-vote by midnight on Tuesday 17 April
